## Div. 1, 2, and 3's Empty Bowls Project

The world produces enough food to meet the needs of its population, yet nearly one in six people suffers from chronic hunger, according to the United Nations' Committee on World Food Security.

One creative way to make an impact on hunger is to participate in the Empty Bowls Project. **The Empty Bowls Project**, the brainchild of artists John Hartom and Lisa Blackburn, uses ceramic arts to fight hunger. For each event, potters and other artisans create and then donate the proceeds from their handcrafted bowls. Guests select one of the bowls in exchange for a donation to the project, then they take their bowl home as a reminder of how many go empty in their own community, and around the world.

This year, the students in Divisions 1, 2 and 3 at Lord Byng took part in this project. We would like to give students and their families the first opportunity to purchase their own creations, for a minimum \$5 donation. All donations will support the Richmond Food Bank, at a time of the year when donations are typically down. This is a wonderful way for our students to give back to their community. All bowls that have not been purchased by



9:00 am this Friday morning will be available for purchase by other members of our school community. Bowls will be on display in the gym foyer during our parent appreciation breakfast and year-end assembly.

### **STUDENT PLACEMENT FOR 2016-2017**

In the spring of each year, schools begin their planning for the coming year. We have preliminary staffing meetings with board office personnel and look at possible scenarios for organization in the Fall. As our school population varies from June to September, it is not possible to confirm classes until the first week of school in September. At this time of year we collect information about students from many sources to help us in determining the best placement for all the children at Byng. This includes information about children's strengths and needs, their social relationships, their interests, their learning styles, and previous placements.

Students are placed into classes after careful consideration and consultation with all staff. Thank you also for understanding that it is not possible to request specific teaching personnel.
