We are pleased to share with you a new behaviour initiative that our Lord Byng community has taken on! Below you will see a picture of our new Byng Matrix. This document serves the whole-school framework that emphasizes taking

care of self, taking care of others, and taking care of place. We feel that by focusing on Self, Others and Place, we are defining how we show respect, responsibility, and kindness in all facets of our lives.

Here are some examples of how we are using this language within the school setting:

1. "Hmm, are you taking care of self by giving up so easily?"

2."Hmm, are you taking care of others by pushing through that crowd?"

3. "Hmm, are you taking care of place by writing on your desk?"

We hope that our schoolwide behaviour initiative can positively impact our school climate by establishing a common language and identifying universal goals for behaviour. And, of course, this schoolwide matrix can apply to all of our community members, so feel free to begin to use this language at home!

In addition, please feel free to discuss the matrix and our schoolwide initiative with your children at home – they're a wealth of knowledge! We look forward to furthering this conversation in the future.

Reconciliation, Equity, Diversity and Inclusion with Richmond School District

A webinar series on Zoom for parents and caregivers to understand and support SD38 initiatives around inclusion and belonging.

This initial 60-minute session is designed to help you understand the district's commitment to reconciliation, equity, diversity and inclusion, and the values and language that inform our practices in schools. The facilitator, Destine Lord,



will draw on the district's strategic plan to drive the conversation and make connections between the plan, the district's vision, and introductory concepts of anti-oppression. By building the language, you can help support your learner as they move between home and school and back again. There will be opportunities with future sessions to further explore REDI concepts.



Destine Lord (she/her) is a consultant and facilitator actively working towards the elimination of racism in Canada. For the last 15 years, she has worked in both the private and public sectors, facilitating workshops and training sessions related to anti-racism, change management, and reconciliation. She is excited to be supporting the Richmond School District and our work to build equity and inclusion and a sense belonging for all students and staff.

Make sure you follow the order all the way to the end to pay! Munchalunch automatically cancels an order that hasn't been paid within 1 hour.
- Munchalunch charges us a per transaction fee, so if you are able to order and pay for multiple lunches in one transaction you will be saving the PAC transaction fees.
- If your child is absent on the lunch date, you are welcome to come and pick up the order by noon, but the food cannot be kept for the following day.
